# Blazing Trails: Rotarians Get Fired Up About Cutting-Edge Station 178!

Club members recently had the privilege of an exclusive tour of Rancho Cucamonga's brand-new Fire Station #178. Located at the heart of our city at 10595 Town Center Drive and Terra Vista Parkway, this state-of-the-art facility promises to enhance emergency response capabilities in our growing community.

Fire Chief Mike McCliman led our group through the impressive new building, showcasing the station's cutting-edge, energy-reducing features. The tour included a look at the new Rosenbaum RTX electric fire engine (only the 3rd of its kind in all of North America), a 24/7 self-service Library Kiosk, and a 250-panel solar system that allows the station to use renewable energy and run off the grid for at least 24 hours in an emergency.

Planned for the southern portion of the fire station property, the 1.3-acre 9/11 Memorial Park is designed to incorporate steel from the World Trade Center and remnants from Flight 93 and the Pentagon. The park will provide space for the City of Rancho Cucamonga and surrounding communities across the Southern California region for reflection and remembrance that commemorate the events that took place on September 11, 2001, as well as honor fallen service members.

This exclusive tour not only gave our Rotary Club members insight into the city's emergency services but also reinforced the importance of community investment in public safety infrastructure. This station will significantly improve the ability to serve the central area of Rancho Cucamonga, ensuring faster response times and better coverage for residents.



We extend our heartfelt thanks to Chief Mike McCliman and the entire team at Fire Station #178 for this informative tour. As Rotarians, we're proud to see our city taking such significant steps to protect and serve our community.
